Guests:

2:00 PM Duane Mitchell called the meeting to order. A quorum was established.

Reviewed Agenda: The agenda was approved. Shane Gorder made a motion to approve the agenda and Melissa Boyer 2nd the motion.

Minutes: The June 21, 2021 minutes were approved with no changes. Ray Trumpower made a motion to approve the June minutes with no changes, Loren Young 2nd the motion.

<u>Health Department Administration Report</u>: Brittney Reported

General Health Department Updates -

RCHD has a sufficient supply of Moderna at this time. It will outdate in September and October. RCHD was able to get 100 doses of Janssen from Roosevelt County Health Department with an outdate of 08-07-2021. We are being told that we will probably not get a new supply of Janssen into Montana until "sometime in August". RCHD anticipates not having Janssen available for at least part of the month of August due to manufacturing issues. We are still waiting for approval of Moderna for 12 years and older.

Shane asked for clarification of Biden's "door to door" proposal, having received several calls from concerned residents that COVID vaccine would be brought door to door. Stephanie said the intent of the outreach was to bring vaccine information, not actual vaccines, under the aucpices that low vaccination rates in some parts of the country were due to lack of access rather than vaccine hesitancy. Ray said he understood that it was supposed to be "trusted indiviuals" being the information, not necessarily the Health Department. Shane said he thought Governor Gianforte was supporting the thought that Montana does not need door-to-door vaccine information. Brittney confirmed that RCHD will be sending out a mailer to all residents with both testing and vaccine information shortly. Terry asked if Montana universities are requiring COVID vaccines. Duane said House Bill 702 prevents that requirement.

Stephanie presented COVID-19 vaccine data. Richland County is at approximately 35% vaccinated among the eligible population of about 8700 people. The increase in vaccinated individuals in Richland County from May to July was also included.

Performance Management – Stephanie presented an update on her COVID-19 vaccine outreach project involving water bottle distribution. She expects a 10% increase in each age category, and we are currently at about a 5% increase since May, 2021.

(This means doing daily phone calls or texting to check for symptoms and follow up on testing needs). Richland County had 1 hospitalized person since last meeting.

Richland County has had one Variant in 2021 -- B.1.429 California Variant Disease staff will be pulling data for local numbers and reports.

Raw data on COVID Cases in county school: # of Staff = 52, # of Students = 120 for a total of 172 cases in the County during 2020-21 school yr.

Noted state-wide 4 animals tested positive for rabies; closest was in Dawson which was a bat. State-wide 39 persons have had post exposure prophylaxis recommended after having an animal bite exposure. RCHD will try to do some education on animal bites and the response to them to prevent unnecessary vaccinations given to those who get bit, there is a10 day window to watch the domestic animal for rabies symptoms. RCHD wants to prevent needless destroying of animals and expensive treatment to humans.

Public Health Emergency Preparedness:

Julie invited the Board to a FEMA course titled "Improving business' financial literacy and management to support post-disaster economic recovery" virtually on July 20th from 9-3. An introductory Public Information Officer training is offered virtually on Monday July 19th from 1-5PM. Julie will have this on in the RCHD conference room.

Stephanie reported that she will be returning to inspections as predicted and has seen an increase in people seeking food licenses.
